Experiential Learning Program on Jan Aushadhi Kendras through My Bharat Portal **Introduction:**

The My Bharat portal's experiential learning program on Jan Aushadhi Kendras offers students a unique opportunity to engage with the government's initiative to provide affordable and quality generic medicines. This program aligns with the National Service Scheme (NSS) objectives, promoting social responsibility and community service.
