Report on the World Thalassemia Day

Event Summary:

Thalassemia is an inherited blood disorder that affects the body's ability to produce haemoglobin and healthy red blood cells. Types include alpha and beta thalassemia. A person suffering from thalassemia usually experiences anaemia-like symptoms that range from mild to severe. Treatment consists of blood transfusions and iron chelation therapy. Symptoms include- fatigue, breathing trouble, sensation of cold, dizziness, pale skin.

On May 8, 2025, World Thalassemia Day was observed at Raidighi Rural Hospital in collaboration with Amra Rakta Yoddha Group Raidighi. The event aimed to raise awareness about thalassemia, a genetic blood disorder that affects millions of people worldwide. Raidighi College NSS Unit-1 volunteers participated in this community awareness and outreach program and gained knowledge about the disorder.

Objective:

The objective of this day's observation was to raise awareness about this genetic disorder that affects millions of people across the globe. India has a significant burden of this disorder with an estimated 100,000 to 150,000 patients with beta-thalassemia major. Additionally around 42 million carriers of beta-thalassemia trait. This makes India home to the largest number of children with thalassemia major. Lack of awareness being one of the greatest cause behind such a huge number.

Educate community people about the causes, symptoms and treatment options.

Importance of prevention and early detection for impromptu medical intervention.

Key Activities:

Public Awareness Campaign: The event featured an Awareness campaign, educating attendees about thalassemia, its symptoms, and treatment options.

Blood Donation Drive: A blood donation drive was organized, encouraging attendees to donate blood and support thalassemia patients who require regular blood transfusions.

Blood testing & Patient Support: The event provided an opportunity for patients and their families to connect with healthcare professionals and receive support and counselling. Free blood testing and screening for thalassemia was also done at the camp.

Education & Counselling: The thalassemia unit of the hospital offers free counselling sessions and education on prevention methods.

Outcome:

The event was successful in raising awareness about thalassemia and promoting community engagement. Attendees showed enthusiasm and commitment to supporting thalassemia patients. Many local people came forward to donate blood for the good cause. Early detection is crucial and timely treatment can significantly improve the quality of life for individuals with this disorder. Prevention is possible with genetic counselling and prenatal testing.
